PLANNING APPLICATIONS

CCC/25/107/FUL- Land Hemington Lodge Road, Great Gidding, Cambridgeshire, PE8 5QS,

Cambridgeshire County Council have received an application to change the Hemington Lodge Road which includes modification of the B660 junction, HGV passing places on the Hemington Lodge Road and changes to the corner at the farm end. This proposal has raised much discussion, via social media, on the overall scheme. The road proposal will be on the agenda for the next Parish Council meeting, 7.30pm on Tuesday 21st October. The Parish Council have consulted North Northamptonshire Council and are advised that an extension of time has been granted in respect of the planning application for the digester, to enable consideration of matters regarding ecology and the aforementioned application for highway work.

DOG FOULING

Instances of dog fouling have increased in the village in the last 3 months.

This is distasteful and a potential health hazard. Be a responsible dog owner and pick up your dog's poop. There are numerous signs reminding you of potential fines etc. around the village. These restrictions apply to all areas including Mill Road, Chapel End and Luddington Road.

Huntingdonshire District Council are happy for you to dispose of dog waste (in tied bags) in the general waste bins, of which there are several. There is also a specific dog bin and bags provided in Chapel End. Please use them!
